Use Atomic Discussions to facilitate asynchronous student interaction. Inserting discussions into Canvas pages allows students to interact around the content in ways similar to what they are used to on Blogs and news websites around the web.

- Insert discussions into Canvas pages
- Supports threaded discussions
- Teachers and students can upvote posts
- Students can report inappropriate posts
- Teachers can control a profanity blacklist used to auto-detect inappropriate posts
- Discussions can be configured to make posts anonymous
